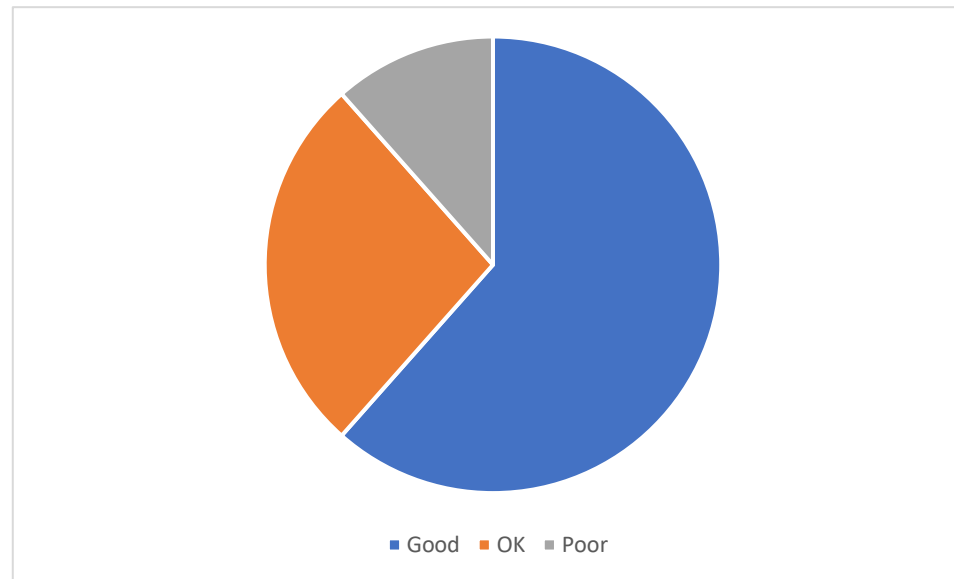


Review – Brian and Charles
