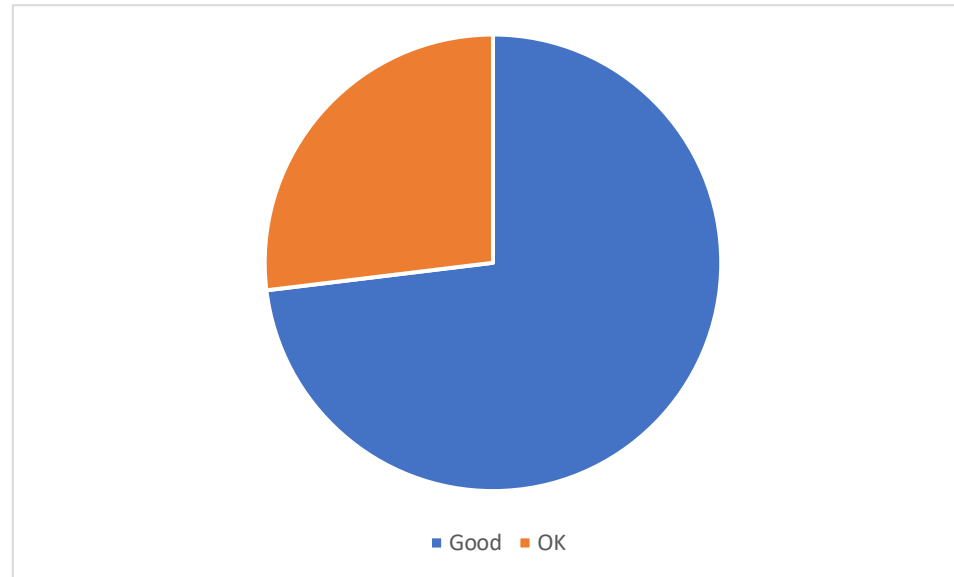


Review – Rams
