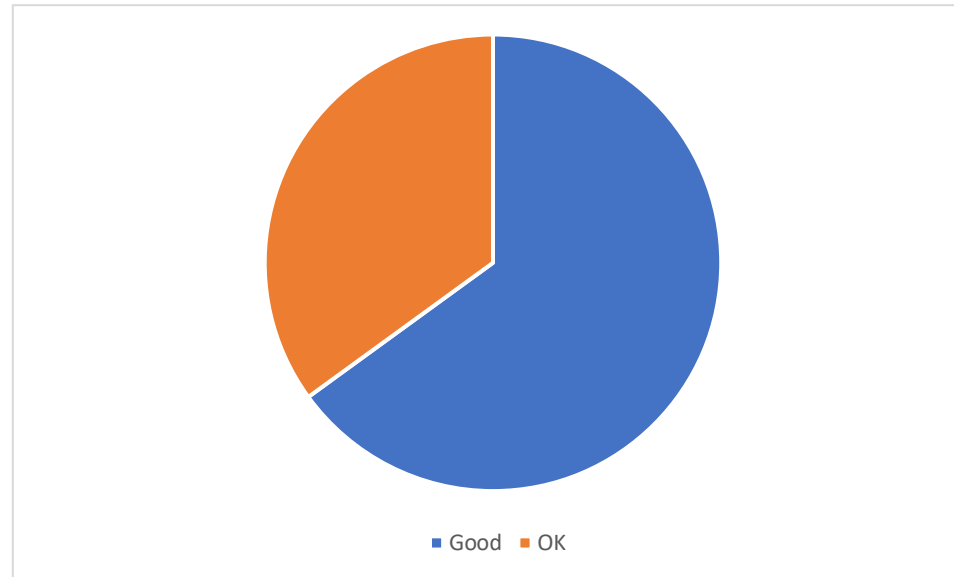


Review – See How They Run
