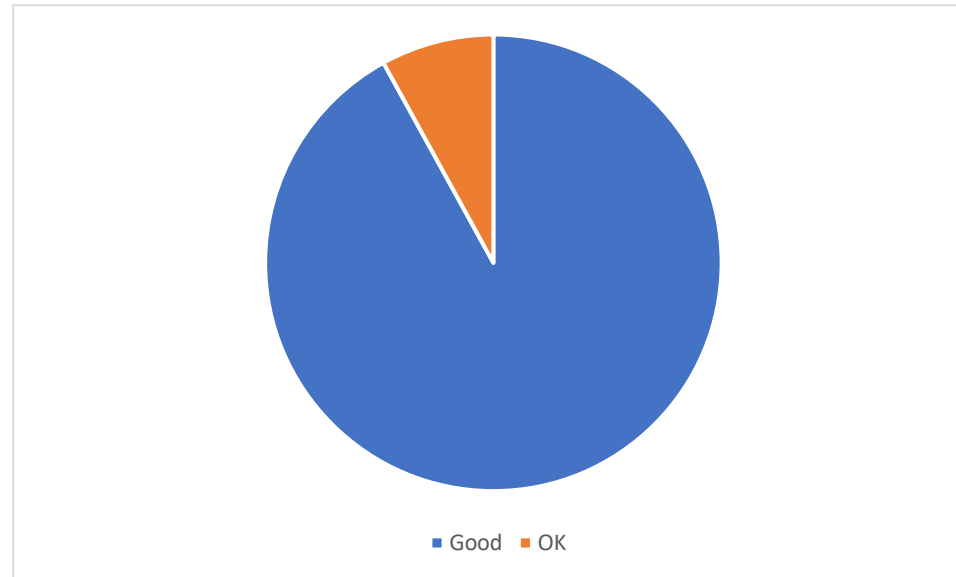


Review – She Said
