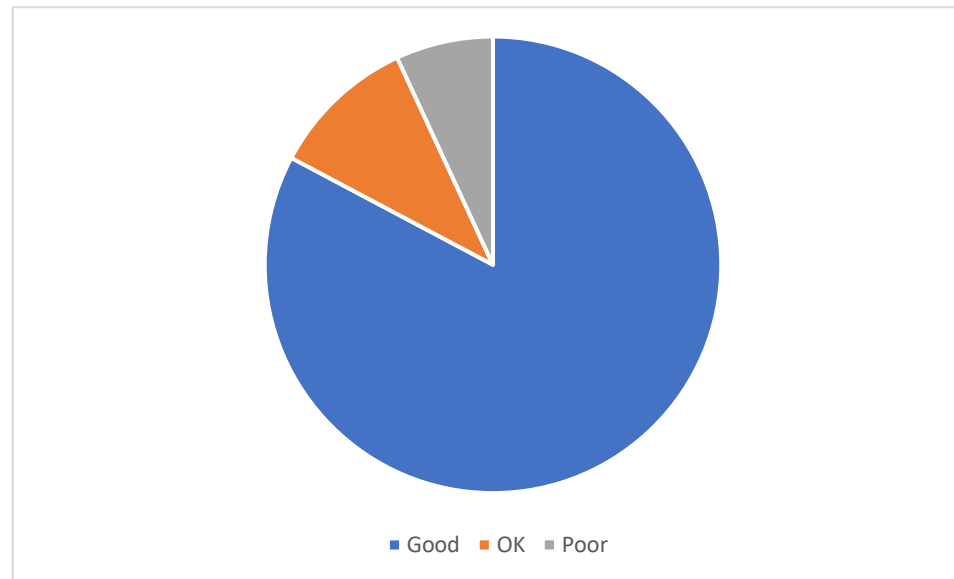


### Review – The Art of Racing in the Rain
